No Bids to Olympics For Germany, Japan
 LONDON, Jan. 23 (AP)—Germany and Japan definitely were banned from participation in the 1948 Olympics Thursday when the organizing committee revealed the two axis nations would not be invited to compete.
 Several former enemy countries, including Italy, are expected to receive bids for the fourteenth Olympiad, scheduled to be held in England from July 29 to August 14 of next year. The invitations will be mailed in the near future.
 Although Germany was host to the last Olympics in 1936 and Japan had been scheduled as the site for the cancelled 1940 games, there banning came as no surprise.




