

## Graduates Offered U.S., Orient Job

Graduating students—here's your chance to sell oil in the Orient, or your choice of opportunities to sell rubber or aluminum products in America.

Several bids have been received by the University student placement bureau for graduates to enter training programs promoted by prominent business organizations which will prepare them for executive positions in sales departments.

### Oil Company Offers

An internationally known oil company is opening a training program in April from which they will send trainees to take over sales positions in the Orient. To be eligible the applicant for this training must be single, and under 30 years of age.

Wear-Ever Aluminum company has announced four vacancies in district managements to handle their post-war expansion. They are looking for graduates who will serve a term as salesmen for their products to fit them for promotion to one of the district management posts. Part of this salesmanship training could be handled by the student in his spare time before graduation, cutting down the time he would spend as an understudy.

### Positions Open

Three rubber companies, Good-year, Firestone, and Gates, are in the market for students to enter in their salesmanship training programs. The Gates rubber company has a sales position open immediately.

Civil service jobs with the U. S. treasury department include several key positions for graduates who have specialized in the fields of economics, finance, accounting, law, and business administration. Veterans receive preference in civil service examinations, which are part of the basis on which these positions will be filled.
