

New Student Loan Regulations Given

In an effort to clear up misunderstanding on the campus concerning requirements for obtaining student loans, Virgil D. Earl, dean of men, announced Friday the latest changes that supersede applicable sections in the University loan pamphlet.

Interest on all university loans is charged at the rate of 4 per cent, payable annually. While all applications for student loans must pass through the dean of men's office, women students apply directly to the office of the dean of women.

Men students seeking loans apply directly to the office of the dean of men. The student loan committee, which administers the student loan fund, is composed of Virgil D. Earl, dean of men; Mrs. Golda P. Wickham, dean of women; and J. O. Lindstrom, University business manager.

Company to Show Telephone Usage

J. T. Welsh, demonstration supervisor of the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph company will be on the campus Monday, February 3, to demonstrate the correct use of the telephone in business offices, according to Dr. Daniel D. Gage, associate professor of business administration. This demonstration is made by sound film and a device known as the Mirrophone.

In the use of the Mirrophone 15 to 20 members of the audience may speak into the Mirrophone for one minute and immediately thereafter hear their own voices repeated back to them. This device is of aid in correcting voice faults in telephone transmission.

Regular classes in office management, personnel management, sales management, and business public relations will have the presentation made to them at scheduled class hours. Other students interested may participate in the first demonstration tentatively set for 8 a. m. at the University high school auditorium, and the last demonstration at 3 p. m. in room 3, Fenton hall.
