

UW Drains Idaho, 59-16

MOSCOW, Idaho, Feb. 7—(AP)—The undefeated University of Washington swimming team Friday swept all first places and set a new pool record in trouncing the University of Idaho, 59 to 16.

Pete Powlison of the Huskies clipped a full two seconds from the set here in a 1943 duel meet as he covered the distance in 54.2 seconds.

It was Washington's third straight conference victory. The Huskies meet Washington State, also undefeated, in Pullman today.
