"Pops" Windus and Fred Samain are in charge of arrangements. Samain announces that an excellent collection of records have been procured for this first meeting. If students show sufficient interest, a jazz club may be formed, Samain said.

Jazz artists to be featured on the program are: the original Dixieland jazz band, Louis Armstrong, Bix Beiderbecke, Fletcher Henderson, Duke Ellington, Eddie Condon, and many others.

The records, described as collectors items by Windus, have been donated to the program by Ted Hallock.
