Dr. Eldon Johnson To Speak Tuesday

A public address on "Government by Habit" will be given on the University campus next Tuesday night by Dr. Eldon L. Johnson, head of the department of political science.

Considered by Dr. James H. Gilbert, dean of the college of liberal arts as a "broadly trained political scientist," Dr. Johnson will discuss the problem of providing political change comparable to the rate of scientific change in the modern world.

During the war Dr. Johnson worked with the federal government in conducting a graduate school for employees of the department of agriculture. In addition to being head of the political science department here, he teaches public administration and

gives training for public service.

He will be presented under the joint sponsorship of the University lecture series and the campus chapter of Sigma Xi, national science honorary. The lecture will be given at 7:30 p.m. in Chapman hall on the University campus.

Oregon Education Rated Third in U.S.

The state of Oregon ranks third in the nation behind Utah and Kansas, and first among the western states in U.S. education, according to a chart featured in the February 18 issue of Look magazine.

Taken from "Education, America's Magic," by Raymond M. Hughes and William H. Lancelot of Iowa State college, the survey is based on education expenditures and results.

Oregon Professor Authors Math Text

The publication of a mathematics text written by Dr. Thurman S. Peterson, associate professor of mathematics in the University, has been announced by Harper and Brothers of New York City.

The book, "College Algebra," is "a logical sequel to Dr. Peterson's book on intermediate algebra, which, since publication four years ago, has sold about 100,000 copies and is being used in approximately 200 colleges and universities in the United States, among them the University of Oregon."

"College Algebra" will replace several older texts now in use in the University, Dr. Peterson said.

Dr. Peterson has been at Oregon for the past nine years which includes a period of three years when he was senior physicist with the 13th naval district, Seattle. He received his BS degree in mathematics from California institute of technology in 1927; in 1928 and 1930 he was granted a masters degree and a doctorate, respectively, from Ohio State.

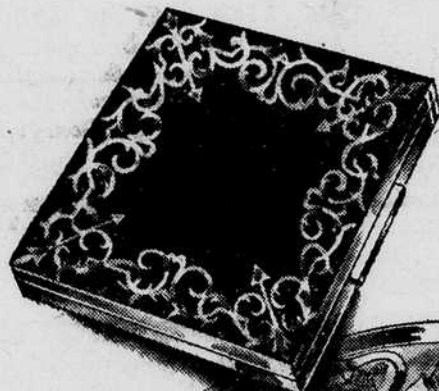
University extension work in the United States started in 1888, when it was introduced by Dr. Neville Dowey, then librarian of Columbia university.

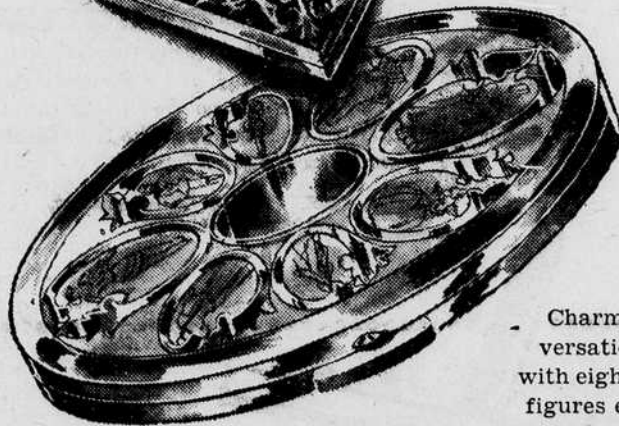
