Custom and habit must not be entirely done away with, however, for continuity and connection with the past are needed in government, Dr. Johnson believes. Change and habit provides a needed frame of reference, order, and continuity, he pointed out.

"Habit is the root structure of the tree of government," he said "and while it will grow in some climates, it will shrivel and die in others. "We eat the fruit."

Education must play an important part in the shift of balance between government by habit and government by choice, he said.

Old Must Go

Old political forms will have to yield or be smashed, according to Dr. Johnson.

Political institutions should be adjusted to the change in science and invention, he said, for while the government is fearful of change and has time-honored traditions, science has new ideas, and

Dr. Johnson was introduced by Dr. Rudolph Ernst, head of the lecture series.
