

French Speaker Slated Thursday

"The Spirit of Contemporary French Painting and Music" will be the topic of M. Jacques Donvez when he speaks Thursday night at 7:30 in the music school auditorium. The lecture, to be illustrated with slides and piano selections, is sponsored by the University lecture series.

The trip to the United States is Donvez's first. He is making a six-months' tour on behalf of the French government to establish close cultural relations between the United States and France.

Donvez has made arrangements

to stay several days in Eugene so that he can visit the coast and the country around Eugene.

Pi Delta Phi, French honorary, is giving a dinner at the faculty club Friday evening at 6 in honor of Donvez.

M. Donvez will also speak in French to students and anyone interested Friday afternoon at 4 p.m. at 107 Friendly. His topic will be French student life.
