

King George of Greece Dies; Prince Paul to Assume Rule

Congress Seeks Communist Check

WASHINGTON, April 1 (AP)—Immediate prosecution of the Communist party and its officials on the ground that they failed to register as foreign agents was demanded Tuesday by Representative J. Parnell Thomas (R.-N. J.), chairman of the house committee on Un-American activities.

Thomas wrote the justice department that "beyond any doubt, the Communist party of the United States is now, and has been since its inception, an agent of a foreign government."

Simultaneously, committee members disclosed that they will shortly issue a new report dealing with the "American Youth for Democracy" organization. Witnesses have called it a communist front and said it is active in American colleges.

To permit expansion of the committee's campaign, the house administration committee approved Tuesday a bill to permit the spending of an extra \$50,000.

ATHENS, April 1 (AP)—King George II of Greece died unexpectedly Tuesday and his brother, Prince Paul, will be sworn in as monarch at 7:30 p. m.

The king, 56, died of a heart ailment.

Immediately after the new king is sworn in, the government and monarch will issue messages to the people.

Much Exiled

George, who spent many years of his reign in exile, was returned to his throne last September by a plebiscite.

Former Premier George Papandreou said the king died at 2:30 p. m. He said the king recently had been complaining of pain caused by angina pectoris.

Election Contested

The king, twice exiled from his country, returned to Greece after an election decided upon continuance of the monarch. This election has been attacked as unrepresentative by Russia factions, but its fairness was upheld by American and British delegates who observed the polling.

The death brought a new angle into the question of American aid to Greece, now being debated in Washington.

Krug Prepares Program For Possible Coal Crisis

WASHINGTON, April 1 (AP)—Employees of the dead solid fuels administration, their legal powers gone, were held on a standby basis Tuesday night for whatever they can do about soft coal allocations if the "mourning" lay-off in the mines becomes extended.

The staff, on 30 days' dismissal notice with the expiration Monday of the second war powers act under which the agency operated, still is physically available for that month. They number about 500 here and in the field.

However, the Interior department emphasized that the agency's powers are gone. Presumably any actual new authority would have to come from congress, though recommendations from the office might get voluntary compliance.

Faced with the possibility that the mine shutdown might extend past the "mourning" period of six days set by John L. Lewis, United Mine Workers president, Secretary of the Interior J. A. Krug directed that the organization be kept in existence temporarily.

Second Edition of Book Set for Spring Release

"Small Scale Retailing" by Dr. N. H. Comish, professor of business administration, is scheduled for its second edition in the spring by Binford and Mort, Portland publishers.

Since its first appearance less than a year ago the book has been adopted by universities and colleges throughout the United States as a text, and businessmen in all lines of trade are buying it for their use.

Professional and trade magazines such as the Journal of Retailing, Domestic Commerce, The Know How Exchange of the National Retail Dry Goods association, and the Oregon Food Merchants Magazine have reviewed it

favorably and many authorities in retailing have commended Dr. Comish's book highly.

Light Earth Tremor Shakes Seattle Area

SEATTLE, April 1 (AP)—A low intensity earthquake, originating within a 40-mile radius of Seattle, was felt in widely separated parts of the city shortly before 5 p. m. Tuesday. The quake was also felt lightly as far south as Olympia.

Professor H. A. Coombs, in charge of the University of Washington seismograph said the tremor, recorded about 4:58 p. m., was of an intensity "to be just barely felt."

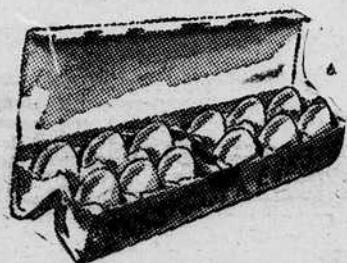
