

AVC Council Chiefs Meet

At a five-hour night meeting in the Commerce building on the campus April 5, newly elected officers and committee heads of the Oregon state council of the American Veterans committee convened in their first formal session.

The AVC state planning board tentatively set May 15 as the publication date for the first issue of the New Vet, projected state newspaper under the editorship of Bruce Bishop.

The group, headed by State Chairman Ray Johnson, appointed Phil Dreyer of Portland to its full-time executive secretaryship and heard reports from other state officers: Dr. Vaughn Albertson, Vanport, vice-chairman; Keith Bacon, secretary; Carl Maxey, finance chairman; H. A. Pullen, Portland, membership; and Jeane Nunn, publicity.

Guests R. V. Mills, E. C. Robbins, Robert D. Clark, and Dr. L. H. Cressman, all of the University faculty, heard AVC plans for educational and finance wings of expert advisers in those fields. Dr. Cressman, head of the anthropology department, expressed particular interest in contributing to racial studies.

AAUW Meet Proposes Schwering Fellowship

At a recent state meeting of the Oregon division of the American Association of University Women, held on the University campus, a resolution was adopted to name a study grant for the late Hazel P. Schwering, former dean of women, if Oregon has the privilege of naming one of the national fellowships.

The resolution read, "Whereas there is such a need for educational assistance of other countries, therefore, Be it resolved that this division continue its efforts to raise the amount contributed to national fellowships to the end that the study grants and reconstruction aid grants may be increased. Be it further resolved, if Oregon has the privilege of naming a study grant that it be named the Hazel Prutsman Schwering Memorial Grant."
