

Morse Says Foreign Program Shows Paths to be Followed

DES MOINES, April 10 (AP)—Senator Wayne Morse (R-Ore) said Thursday night he believes the Truman-Vandenberg international program "serves notice on the nations of the world that we intend to insist on carrying out the objectives of the San Francisco charter."

Speaking at a banquet concluding Drake university's Supreme Court day, Senator Morse said "I feel it my duty as a member of congress to make it perfectly clear to my constituents that I shall be no party to any program that seeks to turn us into an isolated nation because I know such

a course will lead to our destruction."

The senator urged early elimination of the veto from the United Nations and a broadening of the brackets of international law to be administered through the world court.

Earthquake Called Strongest in Years

SEATTLE, April 10 (AP)—The earthquake which shook a large area in the southwest states early Thursday made the strongest recording of any tremor in recent years on the University of Washington seismograph, Associated Professor Howard Coombs reported.

He said it started recording at 7:59 a.m. and continued intermittently until after 9 a.m.

"I am surprised that it didn't do more damage," the seismologist commented. "It probably was because it was so deep-seated." He said that, due to proximity, the seismograph recording was stronger than the record of the Aleutians quake which caused a tidal wave a year ago, but that the quake actually was not as violent as the northern one.

Nine Men Killed In Mine Explosion

EXETER, Pr., April 10 (AP)—Nine men were killed and nine others injured Thursday in an anthracite mine explosion 350 feet underground.

Only two victims were found soon after the early morning blast ripped through the Knox Coal company operation. Rescue workers digging through the debris several hours later found additional bodies.

Assistant Police Chief Ed Petrillo said the explosion, which rocked the workings soon after the men went on the job, was caused by gas. There was no comment from the company.

MEDFORD (AP)—Vince Lazor has been chosen to hurl the Salem Senators' opening game against the University of Oregon tomorrow night.

Longshoremen Urge Nationalization

SAN FRANCISCO, April 10 (AP)—The nationalization of the nation's basic industries was urged Thursday in a resolution adopted without a dissenting vote by the CIO International Longshoremen's and Warehousemen's seventh biennial convention.

Union President Harry Bridges declared, "This means simply that we should let the government operate what it already owns."

Railroads, shipping and electric power were industries specifically mentioned for nationalization during floor discussion of the resolution.

"Here Leo the Lip," Says Harvard Crimson

The plea was made in an open letter to Harvard Athletic Director William J. (Bill) Bingham by the editors of the Harvard Crimson. The student daily will publish it in the morning edition.

"Ten thousand men of Harvard have long looked to you (Bingham) as the personification of fair play and sportsmanship," reads the letter.

"Today, 2,000,000 citizens of Brooklyn—dazed, bewildered, almost crushed by the injustice of Leo Durocher's suspension—look to the outside world for leadership.
