Clad in the traditional red garb of the condemned, the two men had been confined in death row for more than two weeks. Police said the detonation of the charges did a small amount of damage to the

The suicides were announced a few hours after some 80,000 Jews in Jerusalem were placed under virtual house arrest in a rigid curfew imposed to prevent demonstrations or retaliation for the carrying out of death sentences by British authorities.
