The only requirements are that the men participating must be members of some ROTC class at the present time. The purpose of the match is to stimulate interest in rifle shooting, the department said. There will be four stages for firing: prone, sitting, kneeling, and standing.

Organizations signed up so far are Sigma Phi Epsilon, Theta Chi, and Chi Psi. There is no set time for the firing, and the houses may come over to the ROTC building during their free time and make arrangements, the military branch explained, and they are anxious to get the matches started in full.
