Replacements for equipment and ipplies lost in the warehouse fire last February have been slow in rriving, announced D. L. Lewis, hysical plant superintendent.

He explained that the listings of amaged material are still being empiled and that value of lost uipment is still being estimated. Then the listings are completed ney will be forwarded to the state eadjustment board for settlement. Lewis stated that much replaceent material has already been rdered but that deliveries have een slow. Some small tools, a rge air compressor, and some ar asset equipment that had been dered before the fire have helped alleviate the situation.

Electrical equipment has been ne hardest to obtain, said Lewis. ome radio and scientific material nat had been slated for the cience department may prove imossible to replace.

Another handicap to the relacing of lost material has been he great increase in price. Lewis xplained that supplies had been urchased far enough in advance avoid price jumps but that buyng at current high prices was ausing a considerable increase in perating expenses.
