



JERUSALEM, May 6 (AP)-It was officially announced Tuesday night that 166 Arabs and 29 Jews remained at large after the wholesale escape Sunday of 216 prisoners through two explosion-crumpled windows of, Acre prison.

Four Jewish and one Arab prisoner were killed during the first few minutes of their flight and 16 Arabs since have been recaptured.
