## Kesselring Condemned

VENICE, May 6 (AP)—Field Marshal Albert Kesselring, who masterminded the stubborn German retreat up the Italian peninsula in 1944, was sentenced by a five-man British military court Tuesday to die before a firing squad for war crimes against the Italian people.

The balding, 60-year-old Kesselring, once a close pal of Reichsmarshal Hermann Goering, flushed and appeared almost to buckle into his seat, when the sentence was read by Judge Advocate C. K. Sterling.

## Escapes Still at Large

JERUSALEM, May 6 (AP)—It was officially announced Tuesday night that 166 Arabs and 29 Jews remained at large after the wholesale escape Sunday of 216 prisoners through two explosion-crumpled windows of Acre prison.

Four Jewish and one Arab prisoner were killed during the first few minutes of their flight and 16 Arabs since have been recaptured.

# Surprise Dinners Honor Retiring University Deans

Surprise dinners were given during the weekend for two University deans whose retirements become effective in June....

Dr. James R. Jewell, retiring dean of the school of education, was the honored guest at a dinner Saturday evening sponsored by Pi Lambda Theta and Phi Delta Kappa, women's and men's education honoraries, respectively.

Friday evening a surprise dinner attended by 150 guests was held at the Eugene hotel to honor Dr. James H. Gilbert, retiring dean of the college of liberal arts.

Dean Jewell will retire June 30 after 15 years' service on the University faculty. He came here in 1932 as dean of the schools of education of the Oregon state system of higher education.

Before coming to the University he was director of training at South West Louisiana Industrial institute and professor of psychology at Kansas State Normal school. In 1909 he became state

high school examiner for the state of Kansas, and in 1911 he was named professor of education at Kansas State Teachers college.

His first position as head of a school of education came in 1913, when he was made head of the University of Arkansas education school. In 1927 he was made dean of the school of education at Oregon State college, holding that position until his appointment here in 1932.

Dean Jewell will be succeeded by Dr. Paul R. Jacobson, super-

intendent of schools in Davenport, Iowa.

Dr. Gilbert's surprise dinner was attended by many out of town guests including Dr. Burt Brown Barker, Portland, vice-president of the University.

Dr. Gilbert joined the University economics department faculty in 1907, and became head of that department in 1920. He was appointed acting dean of the college of literature, science, and arts in 1925, and became dean of the college of social science in 1932. His appointment as dean of the college of liberal arts came in 1942 when the college of social science and the college of arts and letters were consolidated.

He will be succeeded by Dr. Eldon L. Johnson, now head of the department of political science.
