

## Onthank Reports Jobs for Graduates

Many jobs are available in the meat and fruit produce business for seniors being graduated in June, Dean Karl W. Onthank, dean of personnel management and director of the graduate placement service, has announced.

Swift and company, meat packers, are looking for sales and administrative personnel, Dean Onthank said. The jobs lead into higher administrative work and the starting salaries vary but, he re-

ported, they average around \$200 a month.

Other meat and fruit processing concerns with a call out for sales personnel are: Armour Meat Packing company, Pacific Fruit and Produced company of Eugene, and General Mills Flour company.

Dean Onthank reported that over a dozen Oregon insurance companies have a call out for secretaries in the near future. The secretaryships in the insurance companies have a starting salary of between \$125 and \$225 a month. The director of the placement service said that these jobs do not require a knowledge of shorthand but that they would involve some use of the dictaphone. These insurance secretaryships often lead into responsible jobs, Dean Onthank said.
