A trio of Oregon golfers-Stafford, Spivey, and George Kikes-were the only ones able to find the range. They shared medalist honors with even par 72's.


Only four men will represent Oregon in the conference championship instead of the customary six, and medal play is scheduled (with no give putts), rather than match play.
