New Premier Porter Fears

ROME, May 16 (AP)-Francesco Saveric Nitti, 79, pre-fascist preto form a ne wgovernment to wrestle with Italy's economic problems.

Ill, enfeebled, and almost a cripple, Nitti had only his 27 National Democratic Union adherents in the 555-member constituent assembly, plus the prestige of an elder statesman long regarded as a financial expert to uphold him as he accepted the mandate from Provisional President Enrico de Nicola.

Undermining his position, apparently, was the repeated declaration of Communists and Socialists, second and third largest parties in the assembly, that the new government should be based on results of the elections of last June.
