# Oregon Regains Third Position

Oregon's baseball team hit the winning trail, after three straight setbacks, blanking Oregon State, 6-0, at Howe field, behind John Day's five-hit hurling. The win evened the civil war series at a game apiece, and put the Ducks back into third place in the Northern Division.

The Aggies, after a 27-minute dispute on a play at third base in the sixth frame, made it known that OSC Nabs Series they were playing the contest "under protest." The only question now arising is on what grounds do they have such a claim, and if so, to whom will the protest go?

The play, which drew the wrath of the Oregon State team and in particular their Coach Ralph Coleman, came with two out in the sixth, Oregon leading 2-0 and Ranny Smith on third, Al Cohen on

Oregon broke the ice in the fourth stanza, Bob Santee starting the surge with a half-swing single to right field. Tony Crish followed with a bounder over second, Santee continuing to third. Roy Carlson then lofted a high twisting fly Baseman Don Bower wandering to short right, Beaver Second under the ball, and dropping it for an error, giving the Ducks a 1-0
