Four Art Majors Win Scholarships

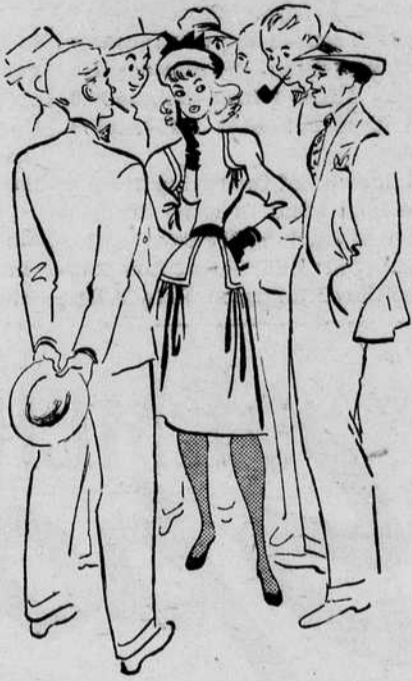

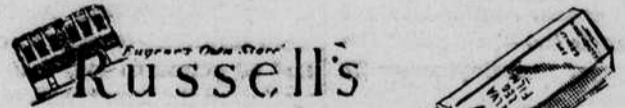

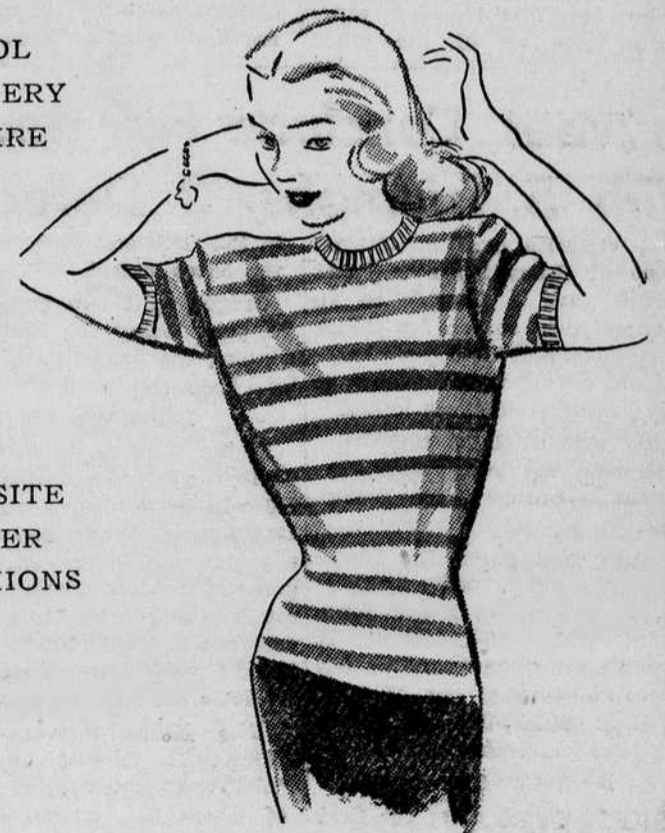
