Emerald To Get UP Teletype

The school of journalism and the Oregon Daily Emerald will begin its third consecutive year of using a national wire service about October 1 when the United Press teletype machine is installed in the Emerald sports room of the journalism building, George Turnbull, dean of the school of journalism said Thursday.

The wire service will be used for copyreading exercises in journalism classes, and the Emerald will have free access to all reports, Turnbull stated. The teletype will run all day so that there will be a full day's report for use.

Due to mechanical difficulties in page makeup of the Emerald, summaries of seven or eight of the day's top news stories will be taken from the teletype machine

and will be run daily, Bill Yates, managing editor, disclosed. To insure fresh news the stories will be taken from the machine at the latest possible time, Yates said.

The Associated Press and the United Press have been used alternately since the fall of 1945, when the Emerald and the school of journalism began using the services.

Microfilm Camera Arrival Announced
