Provisions Furnished Vets Pay

Broken subsistence payments for college veterans will become a thing of the past under the new leave policies announced today by Thomas L. Karnes, training officer in charge of Oregon's veterans administration.

Under the new regulations, veterans will receive subsistence payments for the full enrollment certified to VA by the University providing there are no more than 15 days between terms. No leaves other than one 15-day vacation at the end of the current school year will be authorized.

During the past years, the University was required to make affirmative reports on conduct, progress, grades and attendance and these reports were used as a basis for making the subsistence allowance. Under the new regulations, only unsatisfactory progress or interruptions of training will be used for decreasing the allowance of any veteran.

The new leave provisions will not apply to veterans interrupting their training before the end of a term. In such cases, authorization for payments will end on the date training was stopped.






