"Prayer first and hard work after is perhaps the next step." Miss Young denied that one has to know producers. She herself has been acting from childhood. At home she and her brothers and sisters put on plays and charged a nickel admission. Her first opportunity came at fourteen when a producer called up her sister who already had a movie contract and ended by accepting Miss Young.

At this point in her career Miss Young makes only two pictures a year, leaving ample time for her husband, her two young sons, and a daughter. It is not a question of career or husband.
