SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. (UP)—The weather bureau today ordered small craft storm warnings along the coast from Monterey to Crescent City as rains swept toward northern California. The small craft warning was in effect to 9 p.m. tonight, with southerly winds of 25 to 35 miles an hour expected.

Moderate precipitation over the northern California coast was forecast by the bureau, with heavy rains in the extreme north portion of the state. Skies were expected to clear in the extreme north by tonight and by tomorrow in the southern portions.
