LAKE SUCCESS, N. Y., Oct. 10 —(UP)—Great Britain, in a surprise move in the heated Palestine case, formally proposed today that each member of the United Nations take "urgent measures" to absorb a "fair share" of the world's displaced persons.
The British proposal was laid before the UN Palestine committee on the eve of a major American policy statement on the holy land problem.
Great Britain offered a resolution to ask all UN members to act swiftly on the displaced persons problem because "hundreds of thousands of victims of aggression, Jewish and non-Jewish alike, remain in displaced persons camps ... unable to live normal lives."

LOS ANGELES, Oct. 10 (UP) —The United States doesn't have a shortage of oil, but just of surplus oil, Petroleum Economist Marion E. Dice told a California natural gasoline association meeting today.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 10 (UP) The United States and Great Britain, in a move to relieve Italy's dollar shortage and strengthen her non-communist government, announced their agreement tonight to return \$28,000,000 in war-seized monetary gold to Italy immediately.

Tom C. Clark announced that the justice department had just completed a five-month survey of interlocking directorships.
