Library Exhibits 'Venice' Display

A photographic exhibit, "Venice," prepared by editors of Life magazine, will be shown in the University library from October 15 to November 11. The 24 enlarged panels, telling the story of Venice, will be hung in the main hall on the second floor.

Organized in four groups, government, art and literature, civic, and private literature, the display consists of color reproductions of paintings by Titian, Veronese, and Giorgione; photographs of St. Marks, the Doge's palace, and several portraits of famous men of that time. There are also views of private palaces, and the Grand Canal.

The display was prepared under the direction of John Goldsmith Phillips, associate curator of renaissance and modern art, Metropolitan museum of art.

1964. The estimates were based on past birth rate figures.

The overall trend revealed by the committee's findings is one of steadily growing college and university populations, both for west coast institutions and schools throughout the United States as a whole.

Five States Studied

The committee centered their report around the "probability levels" of college-age population and enrollment in Arizona, California, Nevada, Washington and Oregon.

"The western states," the report declared, "face a crucial test. The 201, library, the facilities are woefully inadequate."

The committee was composed of twelve high ranking west coast school officials, headed by Alvin C. Eurich, vice president of Stanford university.

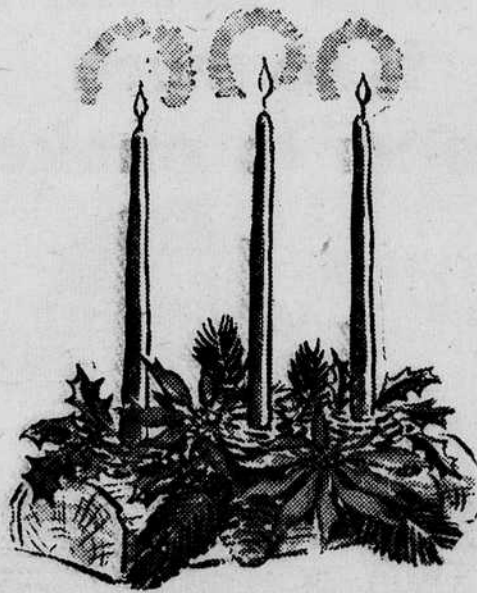
