

40 Seats Reserved For UO Students

A block of 40 seats for the Portland Symphony concerts this season have been reserved for University of Oregon students. The new Portland Symphony has been organized under Wenner Jensen, formerly a conductor for the Hollywood bowl.

Season tickets are being sold for the Sunday afternoon concerts at a student price of \$7.20. Regular season tickets for the same seats are sold for \$14.40. Sold separately the seats are \$1.80 apiece. The tickets which are for concerts on November 9, 23; Dec. 14; Jan. 4, 18; Feb. 1, 15, 29; March 14; and April 4, will be on sale until October 25.

It has been suggested that students might group together to share rides to the concerts on a cooperative basis. Information about tickets and rides may be obtained at the Grave's Music and Art store or from Phil Heppner, 3300, extension 364.
