

Piano Program Opens Campus Concert Season

The University school of music will open their concert season October 23 with a faculty program of French-American piano compositions. George Hopkins, professor of piano, will perform October 23 in the music auditorium.

The program consisting of four parts will include Dubussy's "Suite, Pour Le Piano" and Copland's "Sonata" in the first group; Ra-

vel's "Habanera," "Jeux D'Eau," "Pavane," and Professor Hopkins' own transcription of Ravel's "Bolero" in the second group.

Elmerco's "Lagunita," Bloch's "In the Night," Soro's "Delclaracion," Milhaud's "Sobre La Loma," and Villa Lobos' "Saudades Das Brasileiras, No. 1," "Saudades Das Brasileiras, No. 2," and "La Polichinelle" are in the third group; and Professor Hopkins' transcription of "Concert Paraphrase on Gershwin Themes" is the final group.

Professor Hopkins will also be giving concerts in Medford, Klamath Falls and Lakeview during the first term. During spring vacation last year, he went on a tour

giving five concerts in a week in eastern Oregon and Idaho.

This recital is sponsored by the school of music and Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia, men's national music fraternity.

VA Expects Drop In Vet Enrollment

The veteran enrollment of 2979 will probably drop as eligibility time for government aid is exhausted, Veteran Counsellor James B. Kline said yesterday. At present veterans comprise about 55 per cent of the University students.

Number of veterans in the freshman class is only 50 per cent of last year's figure, he said, adding that only transfers made by veterans attending eastern colleges could prevent the anticipated decrease.

Of the 2979 veterans, 87 are women and 2892 men. Those enrolled under public law 346, the G. I. Bill, are 85 women and 2546 men. Two women and 304 men are attending under provisions of public law 16. Another 42 men are receiving state aid.
