

University Hour Theater 'Siren' Takes New Part In 'Man Who Came to Dinner'

Adele Collinson, singing in the Dorothy Shay "Park Avenue Hill billie" style, will highlight the University Hour radio broadcast over station KOAC this afternoon at 4 p.m. Collinson attracted wide notice after she sang her interpretation of the Manhattan mountaineer at several recent campus social affairs.

One of her selections for today, "You Made Me Love You," was featured on her appearance this summer over the Studebaker "On the Air" radio show in Portland. Previously she had sung in USO tours through Oregon naval hospitals.

Listed in her program for today is a Dorothy Shay favorite, "Say That We're Sweethearts Again," and "You Made Me Love You," "Ain't Misbehaving," and "The Man I Love."

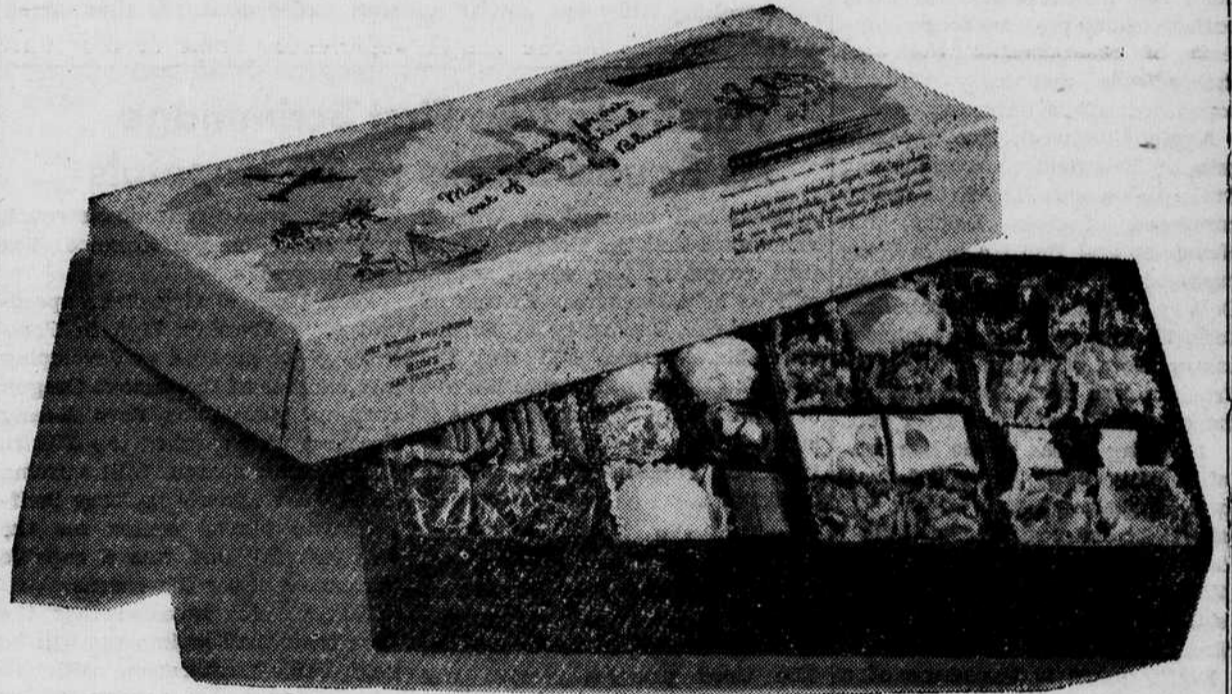
