

Webfoots Whip Idaho, 34-7

Leicht, Bell, Newquist Score Duck Touchdowns

Oregon's rampaging gridders stretched their winning streak to three straight Saturday as they ran over a game but out-classed Idaho Vandal squad 34-7, on a sloppy Hayward field turf.

It was the second conference victory of the season for the Webfoots, and put them in a fourth-place tie with California and UCLA in the coast standings. Oregon's season record now stands at four triumphs against three defeats.

Ducks Score Early

The Ducks wasted little time putting the game on ice. They racked up two touchdowns in the first quarter, added two more in the second, and crossed the goal line again in the third period, to repeat last week's scoring performance.

Oregon's potent passing attack was virtually unused for the second week, as all but one of the Eugene clubs' paydirt treks were made via the water-soaked ground route. Only the second Webfoot touchdown was made through the air, when George Bell grabbed a Norm Van Brocklin toss on the Idaho ten yard line, and scampered across.

Idaho broke the shutout late in the fracas when Billy Williams unleashed a beautiful pair of passes to move the pigskin from the Oregon 37 across the goal line. The tally came in the fourth quarter against the third string reserves. Forty men saw action as Aiken substituted freely after the first half.

Jake Leicht led the scoring parade, crossing the goal line twice and booted four conversions on five attempts for 16 points. George Bell also tallied twice, and Jim Newquist made the other TD. A third-quarter 54-yard run after a pass interception by Newquist was called back because of unnecessary roughness charged against Oregon.

Jake Scores

Leicht, Oregon's claimant to All-American honors, stole the day's point-making spotlight when he won a race with the clock by dashing 73 yards to paydirt just at halftime. With only ten seconds remaining before the half Leicht came off the bench, took the pigskin, and raced around right end. Time was gone, and so was Leicht, as he followed air-tight interference through the Idaho secondary and out into the clear to go the distance.

Less than four minutes of the game had elapsed when the Webfoots crossed the goal line for the first time. From the Idaho 31 Jim Newquist skirted right end and galloped 29 yards before he was knocked out of bounds. After two line plays Leicht went off tackle for the tally. Jake missed the extra-point but made the next four.

Oregon's second score, made by Bell on the toss from Van Brocklin, was set up by the fleet-footed Leicht as he scampered 44 yards to the Idaho 16 on a pitchout from Van Brocklin.

Koch Shows Power

The third touchdown came as a result of jolting Bob Koch's 37 yard gallop through the center of the Idaho line, which pushed the ball to the Idaho 23. Leicht slipped through tackle to the seven, and then Newquist added

fuel to the scoring fire by going across from the five.

Leicht's lengthy dash marked up the fourth Duck TD of the busy afternoon. The fifth and final was set up when tackle Don Stanton nailed a fumble by Idaho's Williams on the Vandals' 12 yard stripe. On the first play Bell, who is looking better every game, jaunted around right end on a pitchout from Van Brocklin, to complete the day's point-making.

Paper Hits Bruin Coach

LOS ANGELES, Nov. 3. (UP)—Coach Bert LaBrucherie was hailed as one of the nation's top younger coaches when he put the UCLA Bruins in the Rose Bowl last New Year's. But today he was blamed by the campus newspaper for his team's 6 to 0 defeat by California.

Sports editor Bob Alford of the Daily Bruin wrote that the game was lost by LaBrucherie, not the players, because he gave them no chance to run the team independent of the bench either in practice or in competition.

"The whole thing lies in LaBrucherie's refusal to put any trust or confidence in his quarterbacks," Alford said. "The plays are called from the bench."

Ducklings Prepare For Portland U.

After meeting the OSC Rooks at Corvallis in the season opener they journeyed to Pendleton and played the Eastern Oregon College of Education, then wound up their travels in Seattle against the Husky pups.

Their record reveals that although the frosh have piled up a substantial margin in yards gained rushing during the three games, they have had to settle for one victory, one loss, and a tie. A deadly Rook passing attack trapped them 27-19. They battled back to slip by EOCE, 6-0, and fought highly favored Washington team to a 7-7 stalemate.

Yesterday's workout consisted of running through offensive maneuvers plus defensive drills against Portland pass plays. Pass defense has been the weak spot in frosh play thus far this season.

Today the Ducklings are slated to tangle with the varsity reserves for their regular weekly scrimmage session.
