

SPE's Win Ice Contest

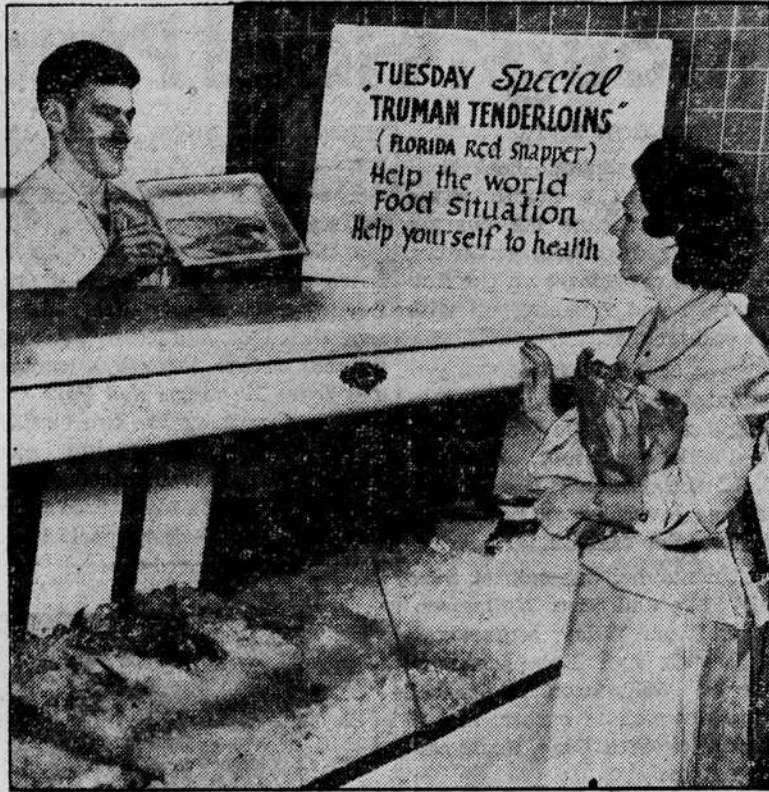
