

## Price System Said Valueless By Technocrat

Evis Joberg, authorized speaker for Technocracy, told a University audience recently that America can produce abundance but that abundance cannot be distributed by a price system.

Mrs. Joberg declared that abundance destroys price. Communism, fascism, and free enterprise, she said, have been but different methods of distributing a scarcity.

### Technocracy Blueprint

Technocracy, she explained, is an engineering blueprint for producing and distributing goods and services without the interference of price. There are no physical barriers to attaining a high standard of living for Americans, according to Mrs. Joberg. She pointed out that this continent has over half the world's developed resources and technology.

Technocracy's system of distribution would eliminate a medium of exchange. It would employ "energy certificates" which would be valid only to those for whom they were issued, and for only a set period of time. They would not con-

## Webb to Lead Seminar

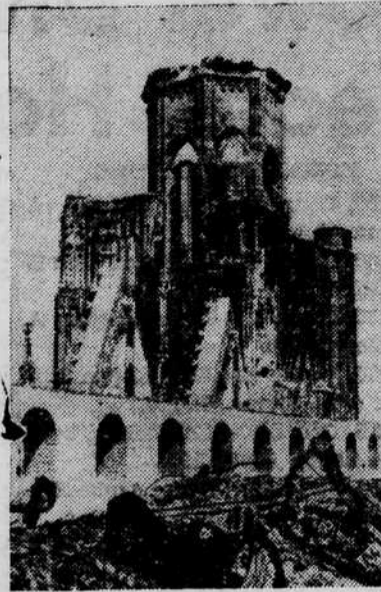

stitute wages, said Mrs. Joberg, since the individual's supply would be unlimited. Spent certificates would be used as orders for replacement of the articles purchased.

### Urges Investigation

The speaker urged her listeners neither to accept nor reject Technocracy on the basis of one short presentation, but to investigate its analysis.

Mrs. Joberg is chief of staff of Section 3 of Technocracy in Seattle, Wash. On Friday she spoke before a senior editing class in the school of journalism.

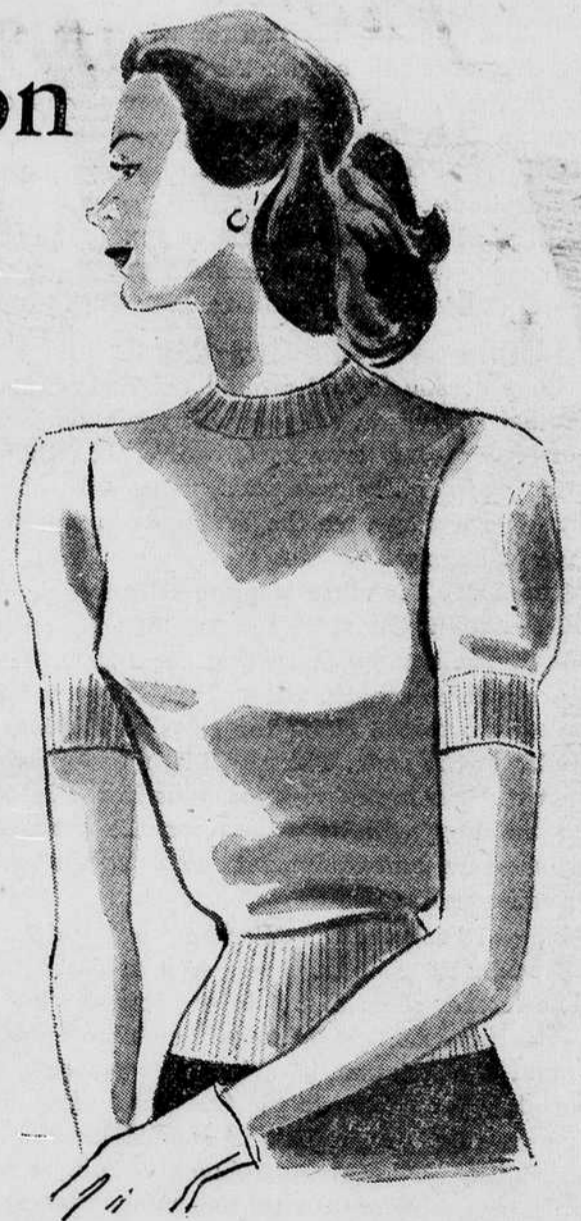
