Town Observes Armistice Day

The campus will observe two minutes of silence at 11 a.m. Armistice day, Dick Williams, educational activities manager, said Thursday. Classes will be held as usual and the silent period will be observed in all 11 o'clock classes.

The University whistle will blow for 15 seconds at the beginning of the silent period and again for 15 seconds at the end, Williams said.

Before the campus enrollment was so large, an assembly was held at 11 a.m. Armistice day to celebrate the end of World War I. Since assemblies on campus have been discontinued, it has been impossible to have an Armistice day program, Dr. Earl Palette, assistant to the president, declared Thursday.

Eugene residents will also observe the Armistice day silent period, Fred Brenne, secretary of the Eugene chamber of commerce, said Thursday. Clerks in the downtown stores will inform the customers about the silent period at 11 a.m. and the American Legion has planned a ceremony for that time. Radio stations and the town whistle will also announce the silent period, Brenne said.

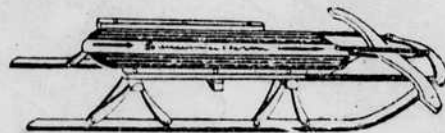
