## WORLD HEADLINES

WASHINGTON, Nov. 7—The Anglo-American conference on financing the combined occupation zone of Germany has reached a temporary impasse mainly because

Britain is unwilling to give the United States greater control of "Bizonia's" economic affairs, it was revealed authoritatively today. The United States has agreed in principle to assume virtually all of Britain's dollar expenditures in the combined zone. In return, Great Britain has agreed in principle that the United States should have a larger voice in economic affairs, but reliable informants said certain British reservations would, in effect, prevent the United States from actually obtaining the increased authority.

ATLANTA, Ga., Nov. 7. Charles S. Reid, former chief justice of the Georgia Supreme court, plunged to his death from his 12 floor office today 12 hours after he had been served in a suit to account for \$28,000 in orphans home funds.

BUCHAREST, Romania, Nov. 7. Mrs. Ana Pauker, one of the two Romanians who helped set up the nine-nation Communist information bureau and reportedly the only one who can reach Soviet-Premier Josef Stalin by telephone at any time, was named foreign minister of Romania today. Mrs. Pauker's appointment to replace former Foreign Minister Gheorghe Tatarescu, who resigned yesterday with three other cabinet ministers who were members of the National Liberal party, was announced in a government communique.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 7 — Alaskan delegate E. L. Bartlett said today President Truman told him he was still a staunch advocate of statehood for Alaska. "Mr. Truman believes, as he has for quite a while," Bartlett said, "that we ought to do something to contribute to the industrial and agricultural development of Alaska and to improve the maritime situation."

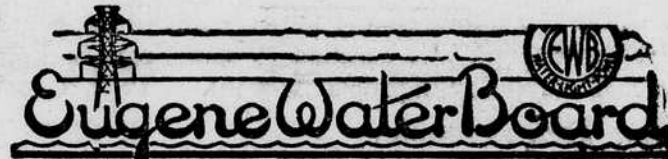

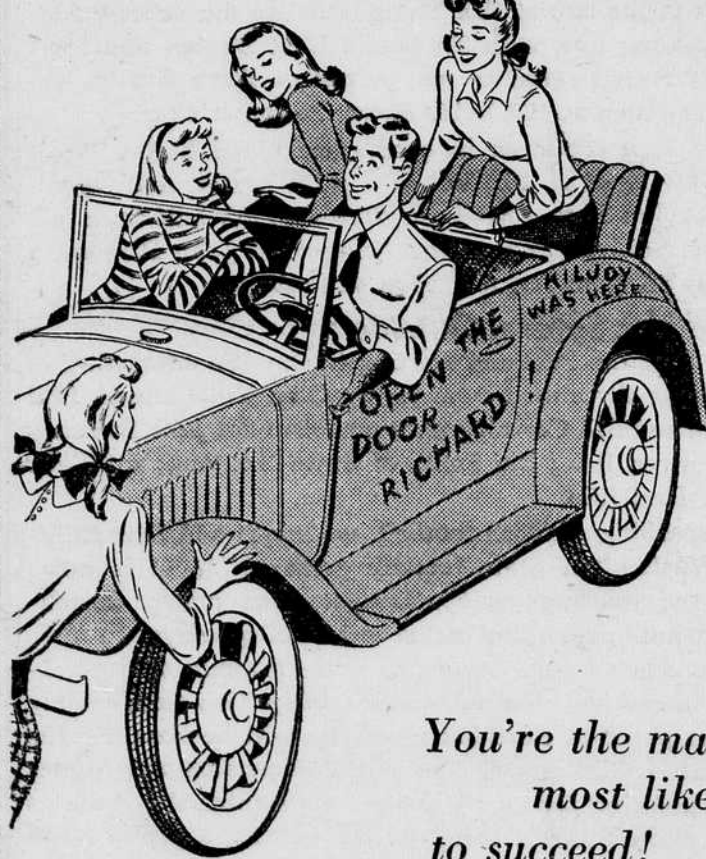
