

Volunteers Help WSSF Drive Gain Impetus

The WSSF drive continued to gain momentum yesterday as \$442.47 were added to the fund. The total is now \$1071.28.

Members of the faculty who have voiced interest in the drive, will be given an opportunity to contribute Monday and Tuesday, according to Mart Pond, chairman. Nancy Peterson will head the faculty drive.

Pond listed Captain Hsu Kai Yu, Miss Lois Greenwood and Jack Merner as individuals not officially connected with the drive who were doing an important job in aiding the campaign.

Captain Hsu has given numerous speeches on WSSF during the week. A graduate of the University of Peking, the Chinese captain is aware of the need in the areas which will benefit through WSSF collections.

Miss Greenwood and Merner, directors of the campus YWCA and YMCA, respectively, have been doing administrative work and also acting in advisory capacity.

Just as Captain Hsu is aware of the tremendous need, students in 16 foreign countries are donating far out of proportion to their ability to contribute. Last year, the average British students donated a pound, which is equivalent to \$4 in American currency. Swedish students averaged \$5 apiece.

Students in ravaged countries are not only grateful for American funds to supply much-needed food, shelter, medical supplies, and means of education, but also for the knowledge that others are interested in their plight.
