He was the general secretary of the student volunteer movement and served as secretary of the first Conference of Christian Youth in Amsterdam in 1939. Espy was youth secretary of the World Alliance for International Friendship through churches and the provisional committee of the World

That bulge in the average student's pocketbook isn't money—it's receipts which he's carrying around to prove he's a student.

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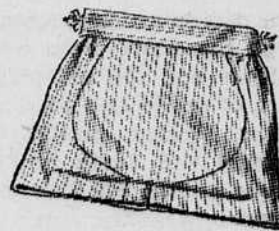
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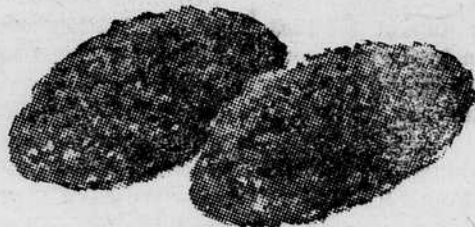
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
