Painting Collection On Display in Lib

Mrs. A. R. Sweetser's collection of water colors of Oregon's wild flowers and fungi is now on display in the main circulation room at the University library. Mrs. Sweetser painted these watercolors while accompanying her botanist husband on his field trips.

Originally from Massachusetts, the Sweetser's went to Pacific university in 1897. In 1902 Sweetser was appointed head of the biology department in the University of

Oregon, later becoming head of botany. He was retired to emeritus status in 1931 and was recognized by the University with an honorary degree of doctor of science.

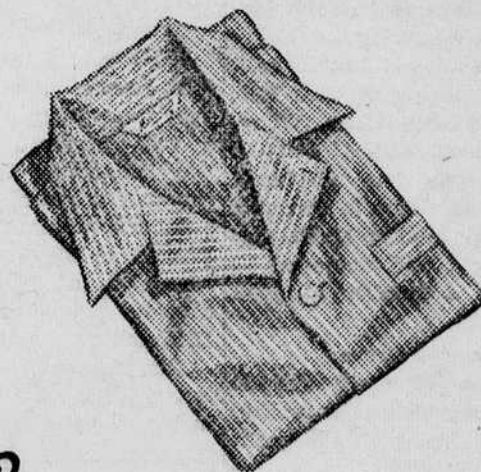
