

Rev. Wesley Nicholson to Lead Group to Hear Weekly Study, Discussion Series Art Discussion

A weekly study and discussion series centered around the question "What is a liberal faith?" will start Thursday at 4 p.m. in the first floor lounge of Gerlinger hall. The discussion, sponsored by Plymouth club, Congregational college group, will be under the guidance of the Rev. Wesley G. Nicholson.

In the course of the study, the liberal faith will be related to the well-ordered life, and its compatibility with the facts of science, philosophy, and other branches of knowledge will be examined. By the nature of its wide and flexible approach the discussion will hold a wide appeal for University students.

The Rev. Nicholson has spent a great portion of his life on and near college campuses. Following four years on the Harvard campus he spent five years on the campus at UCLA, four years near the Cal Tech campus in Pasadena, and the past four years in Eugene.

"Through his appreciation of the students' viewpoint, he is equipped to make the discussion series one of intense value and interest," according to Warren Miller, Plymouth club, president.

A discussion of "Rock Paintings of the Australian Aborigines," will be given by Dr. D. S. Davidson, associate professor of anthropology, at 8:15 tonight at alumni hall.

Dr. Davidson will address a meeting of the Anthropology club on the campus, and will use material gathered in 1938 and 1939 while he was in Australia.

The information to be presented has not been published, and very little is known of this type art, according to Dr. Davidson. Australia is the only place in the world where this art is still being applied. The only scientific investigation of the art was conducted by the Oregon anthropologist, who found the sites through the aid of natives and frontiersmen of western Australia.

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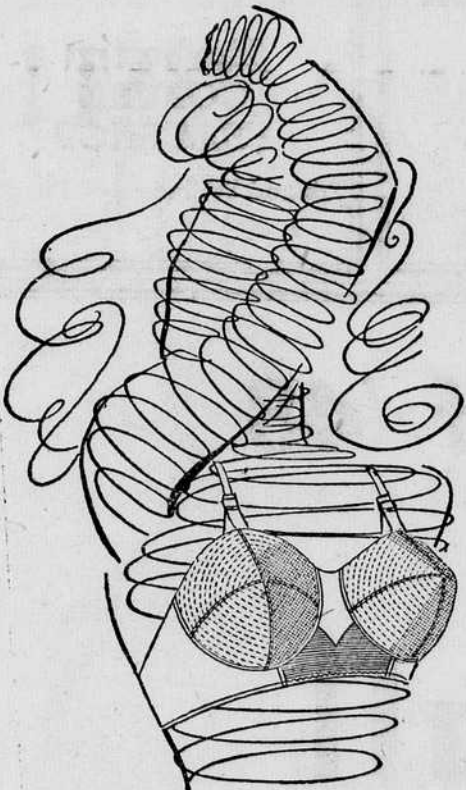
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
