

Libe to Award Cup Each Year

Josephine Evans Harpham (Mrs. Everett E. Harpham of Eugene), a graduate of the University and an active member of the Association of Patrons and Friends of the University of Oregon library, has given the library a silver cup to be awarded annually to the living organization judged to have stimulated the greatest interest in the house library program among its members.

The cup will be awarded on the following basis: 1. Number of books borrowed per student in the house each year; 2. Quality of the books borrowed. 3. Range of reading interests in the books borrowed. 4. Improvement during the year of books, quality and range. 5. Fall and winter house GPA.

Any student living organization on the campus that participates in the student library program is eligible to compete. To be eligible, the house librarians of each organization must: 1. Attend all house li-

brarian meetings or send a substitute from the libing organization. 2. Keep all required data concerning the books read by students. 3. Have an organized reading program outlined for the year and approved by the library staff member in charge of the house library program. 4. Declare the intent of the organization to participate by October 19 each year.

Awarded at the end of each school year, the cup will be kept by the winners until the same time the next year. At the end of twelve years, the house which has won it the most times gets permanent possession of it. Another cup will then be given by Mrs. Harpham.

Millrace Future

(Continued from page one) pointed out to millrace proponents in the audience that many people, not living near the millrace, consider it a luxury to the immediate populace and a physical asset to adjoining property owners. Several council members were of the opinion that the voters would turn down any proposal to have the city pay the entire cost.

Two proposals were handed council members Monday night. One was to levy a special one mill tax assessment for the fiscal year 48-49, and the other was the resolution calling for the bond issue. It was pointed out by the city judiciary committee that in the event the Millrace committee failed to raise sufficient funds, any monies collected by means of a special tax levy would not be able to be utilized and would revert to the general fund. Council members were generally of the opinion that the voters would be more apt to approve a bond issue than they would an additional tax levy.

Circulation Period Set

The general circulation for library books will be reduced from four two two weeks, according to University library officials.

The renewal privilege for books not in immediate demand will be continued.

Miller is president of the political science club and acting president of Delta Sigma Rho, national speech honorary. He has been active in symposium work on the campus, completing 27 engagements in 1946 and 12 engagements since fall term this year.

Among the firsts Miller has taken in speech contests are: first in state intercollegiate extemporaneous contest, fall '46; first in Linfield invitational tournament, senior men's discussion, winter '47; first in Pacific forensic league extemporaneous contest held in Tucson, Arizona, spring '47; first in Whitman college northern division of the Western Association Speech tournament, fall '47.

Allen is president of the International Relations club and has helped in its reorganization during the past year. The club broadcasts a monthly town meeting over radio station KORE.

During the war Allen was an executive officer of OSS and worked with foreign relations.

Miller and Allen, along with representatives from colleges and universities of the Pacific northwest and western Canada, will discuss specific problems bearing on the strengthening of world organization.

Delegates will bring back resolutions embodying ideas and convictions reached at the congress. Students of the colleges will be asked to vote upon these resolutions.

Two representatives of the congress will be selected to submit these resolutions to appropriate persons at meetings of the United Nations. Mrs. Lois McConkey Putnam, Oregon delegate in 1945, was chosen PNCC representative to carry resolutions to the UN that year.

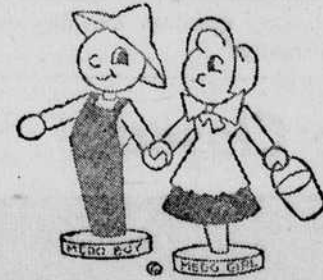
