The West Linners have one decisive victory to their credit thus far, that being over a strong Rainier high group. This meet is a tossup, and should provide penty of tarills for swim fans.


Coach Ray Kireilis has an experienced squad ready to perform today, with several records almost certain to be shattered in the fourman relay and the medley relay.


