## Frosh Engage Vikings

### Ducklings Set for Vik Tilt at 6:15

A slam-bang doubleheader is in store for Duck basketball fans tonight in McArthur court, and in the preliminary contest, a green-shirted crew of Freshman basketball artists, in quest of their seventh victory in ten starts, will square off with the talented Salem high Vikings at 6:15.

The Viks, almost a cinch for the Big Six league championship, have been tabbed by Frosh Coach Carl Heldt as the toughest team the Ducklings have met this season, and have already dealt out a 48-33 defeat to the Oregons. Coach Harold Hauk's Capitol City preppers are fresh from a 59-38 win over Albany.

#### Same Starters

Heldt ran his cagers through a 50-minute workout yesterday afternoon, stressing foul shooting and offensive set-ups. He said he would stick to the usual starting quint of Bob Taggesell at center, Will Urban and Ernie Wilde at forwards, and Don Peterson and Jack Keller at the guards.

This combination has shown potent scoring punch in games thus far, and is a tight defensive unit, with Urban and Taggesell controlling the boards.

#### Best in League

Hauk's Vikings, definitely the class of Big Six squads, will be out for another win tonight, and have proven they are hard to beat. Carlos Houck, Waldo Unruh, Jack Miller, and Keith Farnum have been hitting the hemp with consistency for the Salemites, and will bear watching. Houck hit for 18 points in the Albany game.

Yearling reserves are likely to see plenty of action this weekend, since two more games remain after tonight's Salem tilt. A contest with the Ashland Grizzlies is set for 2 p. m. Saturday, and a game with the Oregon City Pioneers follows at 6:15.

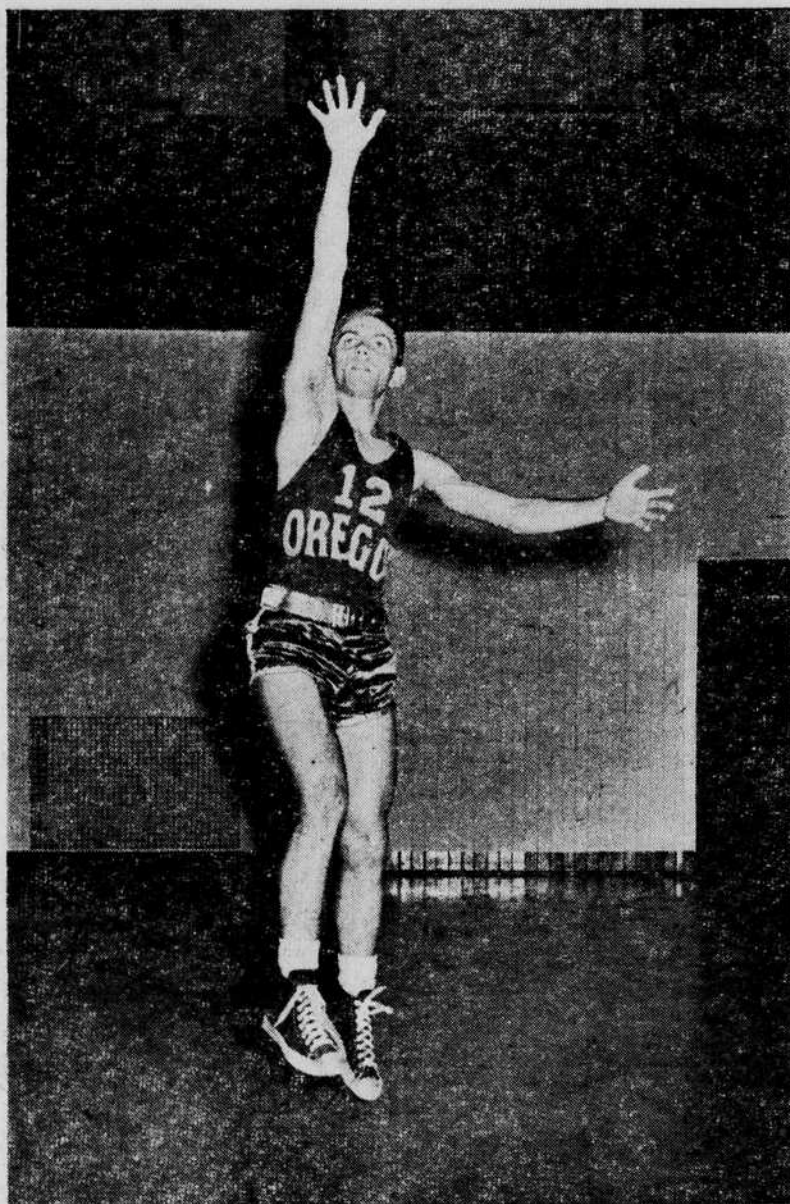

## John Warren's Oregons Face Idaho in Mac Court; Cooper Surprise Starter

Following seven consecutive road games, Oregon's basketball team returns to McArthur court tonight against the Idaho Vandals, tip-off time 8 p. m. A preliminary contest between the Frosh and Salem start at 6:15.

Webfoot coach John Warren announced that Stan Williamson would open for the Lemon-and-Green in tonight's contest, as the injured limb had responded to heat treatments. X-rays showed that Williamson had suffered no fracture, and with the swelling down, he was able to participate in yesterday's short workout.

Chuck Finley's Vandal team will arrive in Eugene this morning. This evening's contest is the first of a four-game road swing for the

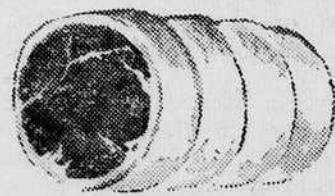
