The Sigma Nu quint came back to tie the count 19-19 on Alt's 20- ooter, and Keith Welch added a two-pointer, on a quick dash through the keyhole. Mobley then converted the second of seven free tosses he had, to put SN ahead 22-19, setting the stage for Sigma Chi's championship comeback.




