

Oregon Signs Another Football Tilt

Sigma Chi, Theta Chi Capture Intramural League Pennants

Cal School Rounds Out 1948 Roster

Late Rally Gives Chis 23-22 Win

Coming from behind in the last four minutes, the Sigma Chi quintet annexed the intramural "B" basketball championship by the squeaking out of a 23-22 victory over Sigma Nu, on the PE court yesterday.

Trailing 22-19, Lynn Hamilton of the blue-shirted victors grabbed a rebound and tossed in a one-hander from the side. But he remained for stocky guard Bob Reinhardt, who sparked the last quarter rally, to snatch the contest from the coals with a minute and a half to play.

Reinhardt grabbed a loose ball on the Sigma Nu end of the court, dribbled just across the center line, and let fly with a perfect one-hander swisher to put Sigma Chi in front 23-22.

The SN team missed several chances in the final seconds to win the game. Center Dick Mobley had an over-the-head cripple roll around the rim, hang on the lip of the basket and finally drop away.

With 45 seconds to go, Sigma Nu guard Lowell Rugg, was fouled but neither of his charities was good. In the last 20 seconds, Rugg and Ray Alt, fired at the basket without success.

Actually the yellow-and-black Sigma Nu team lost the contest from the free throw line, making four of 15 tries, while SX could convert only 3 of 11 attempts.

SX Leads

The Sigma Chi team collected an early lead in the contest, and held a 6-4 quarter edge, which was cut to 10-9 at halftime. In the third quarter, the Sigma Nu gang started to find the range, with Rugg finding the basket for two deadly twine-clippers. Hal Cuffel of the Chis also dropped in two baskets, as SN lead 17-14 at the end of the period.

Sigma Chi came back strong at the star of the fourth quarter when Jack Leonard stole a pass to throw, and Reinhardt dropped in a score. Bob Sanders made a free beautiful left-hand jump shot breaking around the key.

The Sigma Nu quint came back to tie the count 19-19 on Alt's 20-ooter, and Keith Welch added a two-pointer, on a quick dash through the keyhole. Mobley then converted the second of seven free tosses he had, to put SN ahead 22-19, setting the stage for Sigma Chi's championship comeback.

Pittsburg Faculty Favors Ousting Grid Coach, Keep Director

PITTSBURG, Feb. 25—(UP)—The University of Pittsburgh faculty athletic committee today called for the dismissal of head football coach Walter (Mike) Milligan, but asked for retention of athletic director James Hagan.

This was exactly the opposite view from that taken by a special alumni-student committee which

previously recommended that Hagan be fired but Milligan be kept.

The unanimous faculty report said that "Mr. Milligan's work as head coach has been below the standard that we are justified in expecting, even though this was his first year as head coach and the schedule was very difficult."

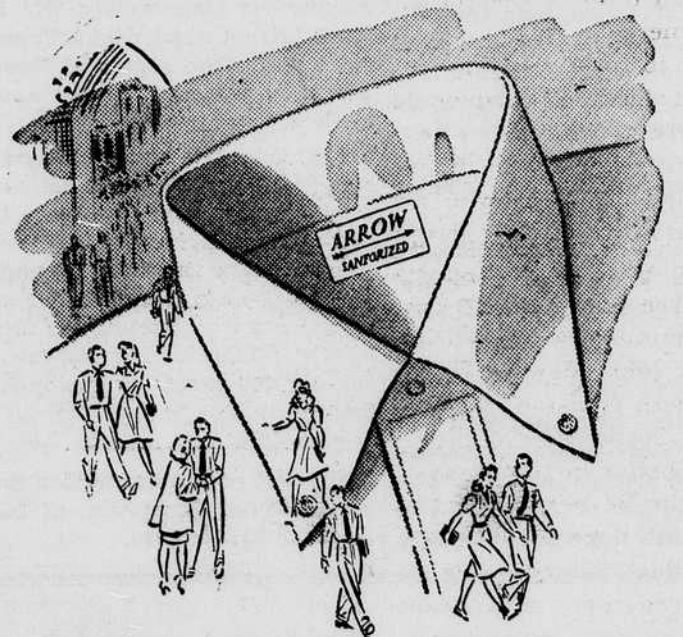
