Thirty-six per cent of the Oregon student body voted on the Pacific Northwest college congress resolutions in 1946. The resolutions, accepted by a 182 vote majority, were: 1) Any nation which is party to a dispute can bring the dispute before the international court and the court's decision be final and binding. 2) Remove the veto power of members of the big five in any dispute to which a member is involved directly. 3) After the period of military occupation is over occupied nations come under the sity debate team, placed second jurisdiction of the United Nations.

4) Atomic bomb secret kept until reliable world organization set up to handle it. 5) Every nation give necessary funds and power to UNESCO. 6) Approve United States loan to Britain and advocate further reciprocal trade, treaties.

7) Bring all social and economic organizations which deal with international phases of control under the United Nations, including a world university. 8) All nations not self-governing, states affected by the war, be placed under the trusteeship council. 9) United States department of education take definite steps to educate the people in international affairs and principles of UN.

In 1947 each resolution adopted by the second congress was voted upon individually. Ted Hallock and Catherine Crombie were the Oregon delegates.
