Nichols broke the 38 -point record set by Red Rocha of Oregon State college as he regained the Northern Division season scoring leadership from Roger Wiley of Oregon.
The Washington team scored virtually at will, leading $40-11$ at the half. Idaho crept up in the final period as the Huskies loosened up on their checking to allow Nichols to complete his record scoring spree.
The Huskies sprinted to a 13-0 lead in the opening period, and five and one-half minutes passed before forward Dick Geisler scored Idaho's first two pointss.
Washington's Bill Vandenburg and Bob Jorgensen followed Nichols in the scoring with 13 and 12 points, while Dexter Linck led the losers with 7 points.
