

Nichols Sets Record as Vandals Fall

Last Two Frosh Games Today

Toledo, Klamath Falls Teams Slated at 2, 6:15 in Mac Court

With 20 games behind them, five of these losses, Coach Carl Heldt's Oregon Frosh basketball players held their final practice yesterday for the two remaining games scheduled today at Mac court.

At 2 this afternoon, the Ducklings will tip-off with the Toledo high preppers, coached by a former Oregon athlete, Lyle Pettyjohn. In a preliminary game at 6:15 before the Oregon-OSC varsity battle, the Frosh will play a return game with the Klamath Falls Pelicans. In a previous game, the Heldtmen defeated K-falls 47-44.

Pelican's Tough

Coach Wayne Scott's Pelicans, second-placers in last year's state tournament, are figured to give the Frosh some tough competition. The Frosh had to come up with a torrid fourth quarter to win the last game.

Starting lineup for the Little Ducks is uncertain, and since the reserves didn't perform up to par in the Rook game, Heldt may return to his original first five. This includes Ernie Wilde and Will Urban at forwards, Bab Taggesell at center, and Jack Keller and Don Peterson at guards.

Urban Leads Scoring

With only these games remaining on the 22-game Frosh schedule, Will Urban still leads scoring totals. Big Will has piled up 186 points thus far, averaging 9.3 per game. Don Peterson holds down second position with 164 points, followed by third-placer Jack Kel-

ler's 131 counters. Dick Mase, who has been a starter lately, tallied 44 points in the last five games to take over seventh place in scoring with 66 points.

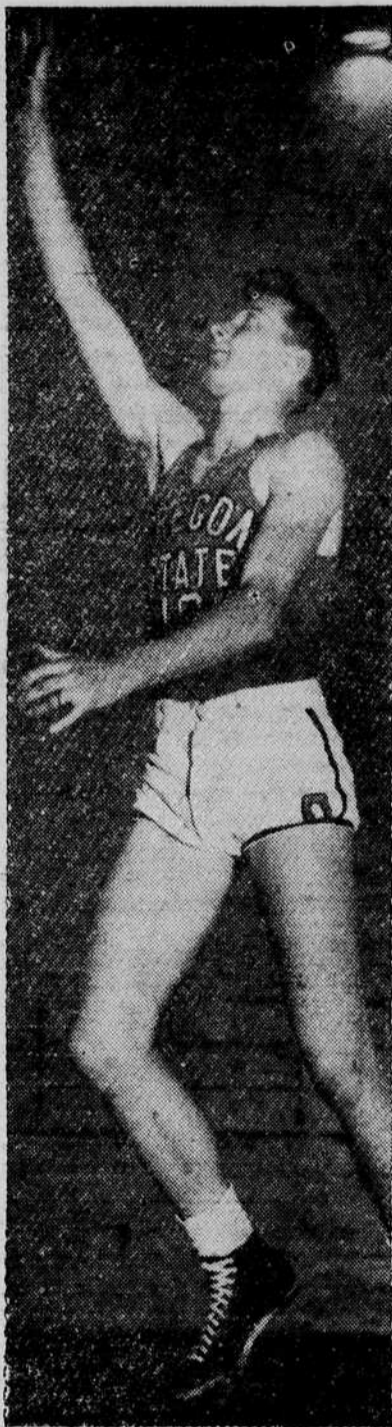

Husky Center Hits 39 Points, Leading Mates to 77-37 Rout

Seattle, March 6—(UH)—Center Jack Nichols set a new Northern Division Pacific Coast Conference single game scoring record of 39 points as the University of Washington whipped Idaho 77-37 here last night.

Nichols broke the 38-point record set by Red Rocha of Oregon State college as he regained the Northern Division season scoring leadership from Roger Wiley of Oregon.

The Washington team scored virtually at will, leading 40-11 at the half. Idaho crept up in the final period as the Huskies loosened up on their checking to allow Nichols to complete his record scoring spree.

The Huskies sprinted to a 13-0 lead in the opening period, and five and one-half minutes passed before forward Dick Geisler scored Idaho's first two points.

Washington's Bill Vandenburg and Bob Jorgensen followed Nichols in the scoring with 13 and 12 points, while Dexter Linck led the losers with 7 points.

Athletic Director Leo Harris Calls for Junior Grid Managers

Athletic Director Leo Harris announced yesterday that he would like to interview any man not graduating before '49 fall term for the purpose of hiring three junior football managers for the '48 season. In 1949, one of the three selected will be named senior manager for the gridgers.

For serving as junior assistant, Harris said that the three chosen candidates will each receive a sweater, and will be taken on two of the football team's road trips. Next year the Oregon gridgers will travel to Los Angeles, Palo Alto,

Seattle, Moscow, Portland, and Ann Arbor. The senior manager makes all of the road jaunts.

To select which of the three junior candidates will make each trip, an informal drawing will be held. Harris stated that he would be glad to talk to anyone at his office in McArthur court, at any time during the day. To select the three junior managers, tryouts will be held among the candidates during spring football practice which starts April 2.

The reason for innovating such a plan is to assure the football team of an experienced manager each season, a position which is highly vital and necessary to a grid squad.

Hen Hall Takes Girls Casaba Title

In a close hard fought game, Hendricks hall defeated University house by the narrow margin of 25 to 23 to win the 1948 Women's Intramural Basketball championship.

After trailing University house the whole game, with a halftime score of 12 to 8, Hendricks pulled up and ahead in the final minutes of the game.
