

Magazine Displays Atom Photographs

"Atomic Energy," an exhibition prepared by the editors of Life magazine will be displayed in the main hall on the second floor of the library beginning April 1 and continuing through April 29.

The numerous photographs emphasize the importance of the layman's understanding of the social and political aspects of this new source of energy, and is more concerned with the practical use of atomic energy than with nuclear physics.

Pictures of the seven scientists whose peacetime research led to wartime development of atomic energy and panels of Hiroshima, Nagasaki, Bikini are displayed in the first group.

The second group shows the development of atomic power and continuing research, and pictures of many things concerned with peacetime use of atomic energy. The last section is devoted to the problem of atomic energy control. It concerns the problems in education, the world sources of uranium, and atomic energy as a weapon of war.

The photographs are largely the work of Life Photographer F. Goro.

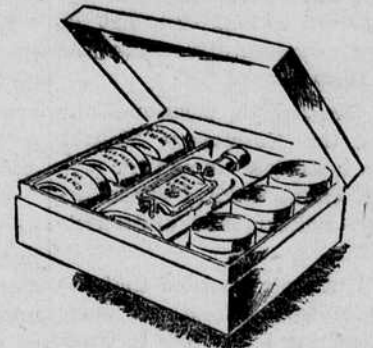
