The struggle for freedom of various countries of the world will be made more real to the people of Eugene Saturday with the arrival of the Freedom Train and its display of original historical documents. The train, on tour of the United States, is sponsored by the American Heritage Foundation.

Included in the collection are 121 early documents of the United States and other countries and important documents throughout the years. The Magna Charta (1215), the Treaty of Paris, the United Nations Charter, and original official manuscripts of the Bill of Rights, Washington's Farewell Address, the Constitution of the United States, the Declaration of Independence, and other documents are included.

A touch of humor is included with a letter from the King of Siam, which offers a gift of elephants to President Lincoln.
