

French Group To Sponsor Paris Speaker

The political position of women in France will be discussed by Miss Suzanne Bertillon of France Sunday and Monday under the auspices of the American Association of University Women and Pi Delta Phi, French honorary.

Miss Bertillon, neice of the famous criminologist Bertillon, who invented fingerprinting, will speak in English on Sunday to the general public in Gerlinger at 3:30 and on Monday at 4:30 to members of Pi Delta Phi and French majors, in French.

Miss Bertillon is in the United States on a good will tour to express the gratitude of France to the United States for help during the war. She was active in France during the war, and befriended American servicemen. She received honors from the American army and the honorary office of commander from the French army. The Gestapo put her in prison, and the American army rescued her just in time to prevent her from being sent to Germany.

Musicians Present Memorial Program

Faculty and students of the University school of music will present a repeat performance of the Douglass memorial concert at the Portland Art museum today, to honor the former school librarian and his wife.

Matthew H. Douglass left \$10,-

000 in his will for the purchase of scores, records, and books on music. His collection is housed in a special room in the library.

The concert will include "Thou Shepherd Bountiful," by Bach, "Notturmo VI" by Haydn; two organ sonatas by Mozart, and "Divertimento for Nine Instruments" by Walter Piston.

Fourteen students and eight faculty members will participate.

Checks to Swell Vets Will Profit

Bigger subsistence checks will go out on schedule about May 1 to most veterans studying full-time at the University, Richard Mengler, veterans administration training officer for this area, gave assurance yesterday.

Single veterans now getting \$65 a month will receive \$75, and those with dependents will be raised from \$90 to \$105. Students with more than one dependent are eligible for \$120 a month, but must apply for the added \$15.

Applications from the latter group are reaching the VA at the rate of 50 or 60 a day in Oregon. Some of these may not be processed in time to boost May 1 checks, but eligibles will gain the full increase later, retroactive to cover April.

Veterans with two or more dependents should apply for the \$120 rate through the VA office in Emerald hall rather than directly by mail.

For children, the VA normally requires a certified copy of the public record of birth. Since March 26, the Oregon state board of health has been issuing copies with insufficient data for VA purposes.
